Composition Assessment Task 1

When musicians create their own piece of music, it is called a **composition**. A **composer** is someone who composes or creates music. In this activity, you are going to compose your first piece of guitar music!



The aim of this task is to compose a piece of music using semibreves, minims, crotchets, quavers and A major, E major and D major chords.

Follow the steps below to create your first composition:



Use a **pencil** for this activity. It will be easier to rub out any mistakes.

Instructions: Use the templates on pages 42 and 43 to create a composition. The composition will use a 4/4 time signature and be 16 bars long. The composition must contain the following:

- A major chord
- D major chord
- E major chord
- Semibreves
- Minims
- Crotchets
- Quavers
- Repeat symbol

Step 1: Use the **Draft Copy Template** to fill in each dotted box with either an **A major**, **D major** or **E major** chord. Some chords have already been filled in. When finished, play the chords on the guitar and make sure that the chords sound good together.

Step 2: Using **semibreves**, **minims**, **crotchets** and **quavers**, create a rhythm pattern for each bar. Do not use single quavers – use **two quavers joined by a beam**. This composition uses a 4/4 time signature – so check that each bar has a total of 4 beats. Use the numbers underneath each bar to correctly align the notes.


Step 3: Change the last bar line of the composition into a **repeat** symbol.

Step 4: Learn to play your composition. If needed, use **arrows** on top of each note to indicate the appropriate strumming pattern. Remember that when playing quavers, it's best to use a downward strum for the first quaver, followed by an upward strum for the second quaver.

Step 5: Neatly rewrite the composition on the **Final Copy Template**.
